Saturday, September 26, 2009@ 9 am: Ninestone Land Trust for early fall field and forest birds; there is also a waterfall

Saturday, October 17, 2009 @ 9am: Woolsey Wet Prairie (and possibly Wilson Springs) for sparrow and marsh bird migration

Sunday, November 15th 2009@ 9 am: Lake Fayetteville and Lake Sequoyah for fall waterfowl migration

Sunday, December 13th (or 20th): 2009 Fayetteville Christmas Bird Count. Each field party will set its starting time.
